Hello Nichole,

Very nice to hear from you. The name "Bilodeau" is of a French origin, interesting and noted. I have included The Governor of Maine Janet Mills in correspondence with this letter, because I thought she might like to know. Perhaps *Federally* is the direction you and I are directed to move forward with my complaint.

Following up on the email I received from you. I will try to be quick; I read the UTC you hyperlinked, and it seemed straightforward my complaint is within that scope. It remains unclear how a patron Beneficiary in my position will be able to remedy access to my own signature records without requiring a court order. A bit damning admission I believe, on what appears to be face value. But please clarify for me if that is not the case, as you are assured in telling me:

"Without additional information, the Bureau of Financial Institutions is not able to provide further assistance in this matter. Going forward, I recommend contacting an estate planning or trust attorney, checking public records, consulting relatives that may possess the trust instrument, or seeking court action to further determine whether such a trust exists. We hope this information is helpful."

It was not. What *additional information* could I possibly relay to you, *astrology*? I read "hire an attorney" and "file a lawsuit" which is just what the offending bank(s) had said. Meaning it's enough money for you to want to deny any responsibility to the point of court action on its very existence. If you will excuse me, that's *quite* sultry. Two other recommendations that seemed non-sequitur in regard to my complaint. Please clarify what you meant by those remaining two recommendations, based specifically on my complaint and its details, *Dick Tracy*.

I assure you; I have everything I need, in simply being the living Beneficiary and having knowledge of these Trusts.

I am going to write it again, cause its free to me to do so, at no cost, whatsoever.

I would like to move forward with our correspondence by stating these Trusts and others were and are my property from the time I was 18 years of age (09/14/2000). My deceased relative confirmed their existence to me and the year 2000 date for them to be received by me. To hear from you that I should '*hire an attorney*' and call my relatives is remarkable, I am going to have to formally let you know here; that I consider what you wrote to be deceptive and deflective professional behavior, considering your position as an institution for the public trust. Clearly, what you wrote was an inappropriate response and this query should be elevated beyond a *Consumer Outreach Specialist*, immediately. I would highly encourage you to base any further responses on the details of the complaint moving forward, as Bar Harbor Bank has already put themselves in a defensive position with their testimony and

indeed a Bar Harbor Bank Teller using vulgarity at a banking customer on bank surveillance video (*). Using profanity at a banking customer is illegal.

Please relay me the specifics, as you are a Governing body, as to **what I would need to adequately remedy this situation to a legal resolution** at the Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions. Because *I don't believe you*. I don't think you are an adept thief. I think for the amount of money we are talking about, Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions and Bar Harbor Bank could dig deeper into their criminal hearts of darkness than has been displayed, and the inept performance speaks volumes of your cornball work ethics. You and I know, what you just did is illegal. But, by all means, don't let me interfere, you all are on a drumroll with this.

The single trust I dealt with regularly HANSLIN IRR TR TYLER SEMOLIC - PO BOX 1671 in 03753 had land parcels 235-021 (235-021-000, 6.66 acres) and 221-010 (221-010-000, 9.41 acres) in Grantham, NH 03753. I paid property taxes on both these and other land in Grantham, NH from the Tyler Semolic Hanslin Irrevocable Trust for decades. This Trust existed, I have the public records, and the bank just denied its existence in writing, (*) *afoul*. That is clear reliance fraud, denial of records, and a breach of trust. And we have not even *started* into the Notary Fraud, theft, and others, including Bar Harbor Bank lending this money away without my consent to have it in their possession in the first place and giving away improper access to it.

I have signed two documents under duress to transfer Trusts at Lake Sunapee Bank which were unnotarized and as such I, the signer remains unnotified. 'TSH Trust' in 2006 and 'Tyler Hanslin Trust' in 1995 when I was twelve years old (*).

Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions looked into them and then said to simply hire an attorney and file suit, or you are purely being obtuse? Please clarify. Because I believe your actions to be discriminatory and prejudicial.

I would like to see these two documents (perhaps redacted by the bank in black ink, in order to buy time for those in the banking system) as they *remain Unnotarized* and I am unnotified and remain employing a technique known in the sales industry as "trapping and cutting." **Is that something that you could have helped me with by simply requesting the fraudulently Notarized documents from the bank, but chose to circumvent an investigation and disclosure?** Is that the policy at Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions negligent disorder? Because I will be filing suit. I had a 131 IQ when I was 16 years of age, being in the top 2% IQ of all adults in the USA and graduated from an art University in New England.

I am unclear on the official current status, but it had been imparted upon to me that when a bank purchases another bank such as Bar Harbor Bank did Lake Sunapee Bank out of State with active Trusts, both the previous State's Trust Laws and the State that which the Bank purchaser is located; both laws shall be applicable to those previously established trusts, as kept in a 'grandfathered' agreement for established trusts. Are you able to confirm that legal status for me or next, are you going to send me a hyperlink of the Fifth Amendment of the United States Constitution?

This is not going to *go away*. I am not some Podunk hayseed you can tongue lash, and whimpers away to lick its wounds in the corner of the room for another 20 years.

I am attaching the correspondence I received from Bar Harbor Bank. Jane Lamb at Bar Harbor Bank has now denied, **in writing**, that I have *ever had* a Trust at Lake Sunapee Bank. I am sure box wine was involved, '*bonjour, bonjour, bonjour*' to the any court attendance reading this letter. That is clear criminal reliance and deceptive practices **in writing** and that would constitute an investigation by Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions into my complaint.

What say you, Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions? I won't mince words, Nichole, I think the State of Maine is involved in this theft and fraud and your email when viewed in context of the slew of controversial and vulgar communication from this banking institution(s) is colored in law. I acknowledge the general response that I am not a valued customer at the bank and **Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions** will not offer me any assistance. Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions' neglect of this matter and the relevant investigation is divisive and a bold crime in itself! I want to be clear; you are a public service platform Governing body, not some French Fraternity issuance *Lettres de cachet*, and your opinion that I need provide more information, while vague, is bombastically incorrect. **In fact**, I need you to provide *me* with more information on Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions' official position which had previously led Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions to respond the way Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions did. **Not doing so** would to be considered obstruction, because plaintiff might *not* want to file lawsuit(s) against Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions or The State of Maine.

Here is the Disclosure I need from this Governing body, in light of the position of its Executive Leadership.

What had been The Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions' official position as to this specific complaint (please respond to all five points to clarify any confusion as this is a reasonably large quandary moving forward):

1. Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions does not believe I had Trust activity in this bank.
2. I will not be allowed to see documents that have my signature on them without usage of a court order as such, notarized documents can be withheld from the Signer indefinitely.
3. Due diligence has been applied by both Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions and Bar Harbor Bank/Lake Sunapee Bank.
4. Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions does not consider a violation of consumer/public rights to have taken place.
5. Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions does not have capabilities to audit banking records when provided with Beneficiary's full name, Social Security Number and more than one Trust Name(s) and financial institution(s) and inquiries would need to rely on more information, with a request from Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions for undefined "public records".

I really appreciate your time on this and implore you to take the matter seriously and specifically regard what information you are requesting of me before relinquishing responsibility of the complaint again. **I insist Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions clarify their previous official position and provide any relevant dates and timelines of the Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions' activities into this complaint, et all.** As well as **verify** as to why my complaint and subsequent investigation was denied as the reasons indicated in your initial correspondence. I intend to continue my legal pursuit of this complaint and as to why its investigation was encumbered, and I will not allow obscurifying behavior which borderlines harassment in my opinion to divert my legal right to property nor damages incurred.

Hello Tyler Hanslin,

The Maine Bureau of Financial Institutions received your complaint regarding Bar Harbor Bank & Trust and the possible existence of property in a safety deposit box.

You mentioned that you believe the bank is holding property that you have some kind of legal right to access via a trust. Generally, a trust instrument would dictate the specific rights and duties between all parties involved with a trust. The terms of that trust instrument would specify whether any disclosure of or access to any trust property is warranted. Furthermore, the Maine Uniform Trust Code requires a trustee to keep any beneficiaries reasonably informed about the administration of the trust. ([18-B M.R.S. § 813](#)). Ultimately, determining whether you are the beneficiary of a trust, whether a trustee has satisfied their duty to inform you of any trust, and whether that trust implicates Bar Harbor Bank & Trust, likely requires additional review of the trust instrument and Maine Uniform Trust Code.

Without additional information, the Bureau of Financial Institutions is not able to provide further assistance in this matter. Going forward, I recommend contacting an estate planning or trust attorney, checking public records, consulting relatives that may possess the trust instrument, or seeking court action to further determine whether such a trust exists. We hope this information is helpful.
